

The Bible: Book of the Law

Remember always that the **Bible is a book that contains God's laws, God's commandments, God's judgments, God's statutes, His Will, His Way, His knowledge, His secrets and His warnings to mankind**. We are to prove all things by that law book, the Bible (Deut 30:10; Josh. 24:26; Gal. 3:10).

God's Will is God's Ways. **God is righteous in all His Ways and kind in all His deeds** (Psalm 145:17).

Satan has a will, too. His will is rebellion toward God and everything for which He stands. **God's word says mankind is being held captive by Satan to do his will** (2 Tim. 2:26). Revelation 12:9 says Satan has religiously deceived the whole world, and that includes Christians. Satan comes to steal, kill and destroy (John 10:10).

Jesus Christ told the Pharisees—who were rebellious against Him and God's Ways—that they were of their father, the devil, and they wanted to do his desires (John 8:44). They could not understand what Jesus was saying to them (John 8:43; 1 John 4:5-6).

The Pharisees gave sermons about God, cast out demons and performed miracles, but they remained preachers of lawlessness because they themselves practiced lawlessness and not righteousness for God's glory in their personal lives (Matt. 7:22-23). These ministers were practicing sin, not righteousness (1 John 3:4). They were full of religious deceit and fraud. They were sons of the devil because they were enemies of all righteousness. They continually

preached that works are not necessary for salvation, but made no mention that good works of faith are necessary for repentance. They continually made God's true message crooked. **God's true Ways are called the straight Ways of the Lord** (Acts 13:10). John the Baptist came

with the true, straight message of the Lord, called the Way of the Lord (Mark 1:3).

These false ministers were preaching an incomplete message on their own authority (Acts 5:20). They said they were servants of righteousness but they had no deeds of righteousness for repentance, just deeds of lawlessness (2 Cor. 11:15). In short, they did not live to please God, but self.

Jesus knows what is in man—Satan's nature that needs to be crushed by the Lord (John 2:25; Rom. 16:20). Jesus says very plainly that if we are not setting our minds on what God wants or on God's interests, then we are by nature setting our minds on man's interests the flesh and the concerns of the world, which is worldliness. He even said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan" (Matt. 16:23). If we are not interested in what God wants to accomplish, we remain sons or daughters of the devil (1 John 3:10).

The Lord desires that people repent and keep His Ways, and become new creatures (Gal. 6:15). Jesus said to the Pharisees that they were doing the deeds of their father, the devil (John 8:41). He said this because their interests were not God's interests. They were not practicing righteousness daily for God, so they remained of the devil. Neither did they have a sincere love for others and their welfare. They only cared about their own selfish interests (1 John 3:10; 1 Cor. 10:24; Rom. 15:2-3).

They were not trying to become servants of the most, as Jesus did as an example to His true followers (Matt. 20:26-28; 23:11; Mark 9:35). Jesus even called one of His disciples a devil because he was against Christ and all that He represented. That disciple was Judas, who later betrayed Him (John 6:70-71).

Satan's will is the evil pulls of our flesh. We are to resist Satan and his evil nature within us daily, until Jesus has had a chance to crush him and reveal His new nature in us (Rom. 16:20; Gal. 4:19). God's Will is what we are to practice daily on this earth as it is in heaven until Satan's nature is put to death inside our bodies by the Lord (Matt. 6:10; 7:21; 1 John 2:17; Rom. 8:13; Gal. 5:16). It's as simple as that.□



Is the Bible True?



How do you prove that God's word is true? The truth is it proves itself to be true. For example, genealogy alone proves God's word is true.

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The first chapter of Matthew contains a genealogy that proves Jesus Christ's lineage. Everywhere you look in the Bible there are genealogies that prove the Bible is true, both before and after the flood of Noah's day (Gen. 4:16; 5:1-32; 10:1-32; 11:10-32; 36:1-43; 1 Chron. 1:1-54; 2:55). There is a genealogy chart, sold in Bible bookstores, that traces all the races back to their origin. It is impossible to do that with a book that is inaccurate or spurious. Yes, genealogy is one way to prove the Bible is true and accurate.

Adam is referred to as a historical person by Jesus' brother Jude, the Apostle Paul, and by Job (Jude 14; 1 Tim. 2:13-14; 1 Cor. 15:22, 45; Rom. 5:14; Job 31:33; Hosea 6:7). Melchizedek was mentioned as a true historical character in Genesis 14:18 and again by the Apostle Paul in Hebrews 7:1. Abel and Enoch were mentioned in the book of Hebrews as real people (Heb. 11:4-5). Are these great men of the Bible wrong?

How about the story of Noah and the worldwide flood? Jesus mentioned it as a fact. Is He a liar (Matt. 24:37-39)? Both the ark and Noah are mentioned as true historical facts by the Apostle Paul in Hebrews 11:7. Paul was a learned man—a Pharisee and the son of a Pharisee. Notice, there are other Scriptures mentioning the flood (2 Peter 2:5; Luke 6:48). The Apostle Peter said that only Noah and seven others were spared when God brought a flood upon the world. King David also talked about the flood (Psalm 29:10).

Either Genesis 7:20-24 is correct, or the whole world is in trouble. God spoke to Isaiah the prophet about the flood of Noah that covered the earth (Is. 54:9). Noah is mentioned in Ezekiel as a historical person. Noah existed after the flood that destroyed the entire world and all life that was on the face of the earth. Why would God have Noah collect certain animals and birds if it was only going to be a local flood? Think!

Is the Bible True?

Archaeology also proves the Bible is true. The fossil record provides proof of the flood. It is possible to find sea shells and the remains of fossilized fish on every mountain top of the world. For example, in the southern United States, there are so many whale bones scattered on the mountain tops of one mountain range that local farmers use them as fence posts on their farms. These mountains were once under water.

How about Jonah and the big fish? Was that a fairy tale, or was it true? Jesus used the sign of Jonah to prove to the world that He was the Messiah. In Matthew 12:41, Jesus said Jonah preached repentance. Is Jesus a liar? He also said Jonah was in the belly of a sea monster (Matt. 12:40; 16:4; Luke 11:29-30). It was called a fish in Jonah 1:17 and 2:10.



The Best Bible

The best translation of the Bible is the one that has the clearest meaning to the key verses that explain how to live the Way that Jesus Christ lived.

One example is Titus 2:14. In the original Greek it says, "...cleanse for Himself a people zealous for good works." In the King James Version it says, "... purify unto Himself a peculiar people zealous of good works." The New American Standard Version says, "...zealous for good deeds," and so does the Revised Standard Version. The Living Bible, the New International Version, and **other modern language versions change, water down and distort this verse**, along with Titus 3:8-14.

If you do not maintain good works or good deeds, you have stopped bearing good fruit for God (Matt. 3:10). If you are not zealous for good deeds, you are leaving a door open through which you can be tempted by Satan (1 Peter 3:13; 5:8).

Do you think Jesus Christ overcame the world by doing nothing? Of course not. He overcame the world by doing the Father's Will—which is righteousness—every day. Jesus only lived to do good towards others, as He instructed us to do daily. Jesus never lived to do His own will but only the Father's Will, continually (John 6:38). To bear fruit for God is to practice righteousness (Col. 1:10). To bear fruit is to be a doer of the word (James 1:22). To bear fruit is to experience a change of nature, a change of heart and a change of attitude, as happy slaves of Jesus Christ, until we finally do the Will of God from the heart (Matt. 5:16, 20; 6:1; Eph. 6:6).

The Will of God is righteousness and that's what we are to be practicing. We do the practicing so God can do the perfecting.

The Bible with the clearest meaning and the most reliable to the original Greek is the New American Standard Version, but always have a King James Version close by to double-check some passages, as it is the oldest version but not always the easiest to understand. Try comparing 2 Timothy 2:15, Hebrews 12:14, 1 John 5:7 and Acts 12:4 in these two versions.

Of course, if you have a Bible that you love and are wearing out for God by studying it daily, just continue and the Lord will continue to teach you through His word.□



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
